## WORKSHOP PROGRAM

During the 2 days of PIX/AMC 2012, a number of free workshops will be conducted, covering areas such as breeder management, hatchery management and disease investigation, all run by leaders in their field.

### » BREEDERS

Dr Keith Bramwell from the University of Arkansas will lead workshops discussing how to optimise egg quality and viability. With a maximum of 50 people per workshop you're sure to have your questions addressed. The one and a half hour workshop will be repeated 4 times.

### » HATCHERY
